## Condominium Named After Former AHC Board Member

*Project will provide 10 affordable homes in Nauck neighborhood*

AHC is naming an upcoming affordable condominium project "Davis Place" after Jennie Davis, a long-time community activist in the Nauck community where the new homes will be located. Jennie Davis was a founder of AHC and a long-time Board member. The project includes 10 two and three-bedroom units targeted at first-time homebuyers with incomes below 80 percent of Arlington's median income. Construction is expected to be completed by early summer 2009. The land was donated by an anonymous donor.



## New Preschool Opens at Gates of Ballston

*Preschool will serve up to 16 children from the neighborhood*

The Gates of Ballston community center welcomed its youngest occupants last week with a new preschool operated by [Child and Family Network Center](#). The school, which will serve up to 16 children from the neighborhood, prepares children for kindergarten. The organization also runs a preschool at AHC's Virginia Gardens apartment community. The Child and Family Network, long-time partners with AHC, was recently featured in a Washington Post article, "[The Littlest Victims of the Mortgage Crisis](#)" about the challenges facing local nonprofits with the possible loss of Freddie Mac Foundation funding.

## AHC Residents Receive Energy Efficient Light Bulbs
